NNC for Lakes Response Endpoints

- Occurrence of eutrophication-related mortality or morbidity events for fish and other aquatic organisms
- Epilimnetic excursions from dissolved oxygen or pH criteria
- Cyanobacteria counts in excess of 100,000 cells/mL
- Observed shifts in aquatic diversity attributed to eutrophication
- Excessive levels of mineral turbidity that consistently limit algal productivity during the period of May 1 September 30


- Implementation will start shortly after approval of the WQS

2020 Listing Methodology Document

- Revisions tabled by the Commission in January 2018
- WPP staff held numerous stakeholder meetings to resolve a variety of concerns
- Commission approved revisions in July 2018
- Last remaining issues will be discussed later this month in addition to Lake NNC assessment methodologies

Impaired Streams and Lakes






2018 303d List of Impaired Waters


- Approved by CWC in January 2018
- In compiling the List for submission staff uncovered a deficiency in the list PN
- MO law requires public notice of the proposed list in 6 regional newspapers however only 5 were published due to billing issues with the 6th.
- WPP had to restart the process due to this issue. Expect re-approval in October 2018




Permit Backlog Reduction

- 4 Appeal decision

- Approved the 2018 Intended Use Plan for SRF
- 2 Permit Public Hearings
- Rescinded 9 rules
- Held numerous hearings on rule amendments and other actions.
